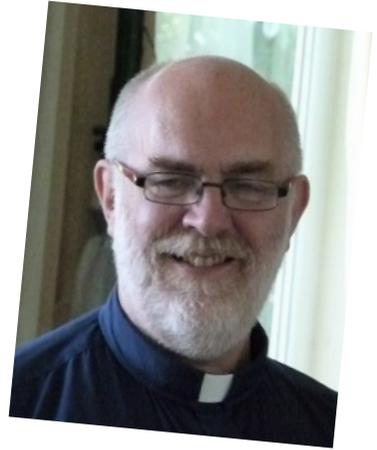

# From the Rector



*Dear Friends,*

**I was given a jigsaw puzzle recently when we were going on holiday. I enjoy making puzzles, but it is something I only ever do on holiday. This one was 1000 pieces and was fun. Fun because the picture on the box was a cartoon of a town square in the 1950's, whereas the picture on the puzzle was the same square but this time in about 2010. However, I made it, and left it at the holiday cottage for later guests to enjoy.**

Puzzles are really only totally satisfying if all the pieces are there. It is only possible to get the true picture if all the pieces are in place (although one piece in a thousand is not too serious!).

In terms of the great events of the Christian faith and Christian Calendar, there are only four pieces to put into place, but we need all four to get the true picture, the complete picture. Sadly, there are two of the pieces often misplaced, or forgotten, or lost – the two great events which we particularly remember in the month of May. Four pieces.....?

The first piece of the puzzle of Christian faith is obviously Christmas, when we understand the love of God in sending his son to become one of us – born as a baby, growing as a youth, reaching adulthood to experience

what it is to be one of us, and to experience all the horrors as well as joys of being human. We call it the incarnation.

The second piece of the puzzle is Easter when we remember the death and resurrection of Christ, the love that would die on the cross to bring us forgiveness of our sinfulness, to build a new bridge between God and humankind, to allow us to enter the presence of God, to reveal to us that he has defeated death in the resurrection from the dead.

But then two more pieces showing us yet more of the love of Christ, the love of God, revealing our faith in all its fullness – two events we celebrate this month.

On Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> May we celebrate the Ascension. We celebrate the day Christ left earth and returned to the presence of God. We celebrate the love shown to us by God at that great event. At first sight we might not get it – how is it loving to leave people to struggle? Yet it was one of the great acts of God, because it is the moment when the disciples stop being followers, stop being servants, but become the body of Christ. It is that moment when Christ says – I love my people so much I will trust them to be me! I love my people so much that I will give them the opportunity to be my body here on earth. If Christ had stayed we would have always been servants of his. By

his leaving, he raised us to be his body – and that is love!

Of course there is more to the ascension as well – suddenly we know that we matter because there is one of our own, Jesus Christ, who is part of the human family – one of us living and interceding and representing us in the presence of God. And to have one of us there is to show a love for, and a favour to us that is vital to us. The ascension is the third piece of the puzzle to give us a full picture of our faith, a full picture of the love of God.

The fourth piece of the puzzle – Pentecost, which we celebrate on Sunday 15<sup>th</sup> May. At Christmas, we remember the love of God given to us in the incarnation. At Easter, we celebrate the love given to us in the death and resurrection of Christ. At Ascension, we grasp the love given to us as Christ trusts us to be him. At Pentecost, we celebrate the love given to us through the Holy Spirit to strengthen us as we fulfil our calling to be the body of Christ.

# Teaspoons and Cats . . . .

**Sometimes the things you are taught in younger days can be a help in our daily lives as Christians. For me personally Teaspoons and Cats are two of those things I was taught. What? Well, it is all about the question we always face – how do we pray?**

There is a huge amount written about prayer. There is a saying – “When all is said and done, there’s a lot more said than done!” It is certainly a phrase that can be applied to prayer! There always seems to be a lot more said about prayer, than praying done. So – what has teaspoons and cats got to do with prayer?

Another issue about prayer is that many people see it simply as asking for things. Sometimes it’s for ourselves, sometimes for others. But prayer is a lot more than just asking for things. Somehow we need a reminder, a structure for prayer. And that’s where we get to Teaspoons and Cats!

Teaspoons first. We use an abbreviation for a teaspoon, especially when measuring stuff for a recipe. A teaspoon is “tsp.” It is those three letters that can be used for prayer. We are now in the world of acronyms. Using the three letters as initials, it is simply saying that in prayer we start with “Thank you,” then get on to “Sorry” and then finish with “Please.” And for me that seems to be a particularly effective

understanding of prayer: Thank you; Sorry; Please.


So what about CATS. Well, some would argue that it should really be ACTS (to fit in with a bible based word, useful as a reminder. But CATS feels better to me. And again it is an acronym. C = Confession. A = Adoration. T = Thanksgiving. S = Supplication (a posh word for asking for things). Again, a good picture of what prayer should be. Confession; Adoration; Thanksgiving and Supplication.

I always worry about two approaches people have to prayer. The first worry I have is when people tell me “This is how I do it.” And they have their own special way of prayer that they think is all they need. We should always be asking – am I praying as I should? Are there new ways of prayer? Are there other things I could do to make my relationship with God better? Using simple things like these acronyms is very helpful in the process. It helps us ask: am I saying thank you enough? Am I saying sorry enough? Am I asking enough? Am I doing too much of any of these things? Reflecting on how we pray is sometimes as important as our prayers themselves.

The second worry I have is when people make prayer too complicated. Sometimes that happens with prayer plans, or forms of liturgy. Sometimes that happens as we read deeper thinkers on prayer. Sometimes it happens when we worry too much about whether our prayer will be answered or not.

Sometimes it happens when we worry about whether we are using the right words. Trouble is, the more complicated we make it, the more worried we are we will fail, and the more





likely it is we will set prayer aside. Using simple acronyms is a useful way of bringing us back to the simplicity of prayer and our relationship with God. All I've got to do is say sorry. All I've got to do is say thank you and praise Him. All I've got to do is ask . . .

No cats were hurt in the writing and preparation of this article! But when I pray I grab my Cats, or my Teaspoon, and then it works!

# St. Cyprian's and Social Media . .

There is no doubt that churches have to advertise, and have done over the years, through posters, signs, church magazine, weekly pew sheet etc. They are all ways that we advertise. However, churches also need to advertise through modern forms of communications, and over recent times we have done this, using both Facebook and twitter.

We try, at St. Cyprian's, to advertise all of our events through these media, and it has brought us some success. For example for the last two years we have had a "successful" Christingle, with a number of families joining us having seen the service advertised through both twitter and Facebook.

Twitter: our address is @LenzieChurch. I tend to use twitter for "short notice" advertising, putting up details of services and events the same day, or the evening before. Twitter is a bit limited because of the small number of characters you can use in a "tweet:" just 140. However, we are lucky that we are "followed" by a number of individuals and groups in Lenzie who do "re-tweet" us regularly.

Facebook: If you put "St Cyprian's Church, Lenzie" into the Facebook search



engine you will find

us! On our Facebook page we give more information about events, as well as a bit more notice – normally about a week ahead. I do believe that Facebook is an important means of advertising and communication. Check us out there. If you go there, than please "like" anything we put up, and even better "share" what we put up. Liking is a good way of widening our advertising; sharing is even better!

As well as our own Facebook page, we also use other Facebook pages – for example we post events on the Kirkintilloch Herald Facebook page, and as well as reaching the over 4,000 friends of the Herald, they take many of our posts and put them in the community section of the paper itself.

I know a number of our members do check out our Facebook page regularly. If you are into modern technology, then please check us out, and it is perhaps a small but very effective way for all of us to share in the mission and outreach of our church by sharing the information and posts we put there. And even more importantly, we have already seen that use of social media works!

Picture a young mother of four. Her husband has left. She has no land. No assets. No savings. And the only work she can get is backbreaking manual labour for as little as 74p a day. Her home has been flooded several times, and last August it flooded again. This is Morsheda. She's our neighbour, and she desperately needs our help.

From 15-21 May, our church will join with more than 20,000 others across the country for the sake of people like Morsheda. Across the UK and Ireland we will deliver 7 million envelopes to our local neighbours to raise money for our global neighbours in need. A new chance at life for Morsheda costs as little as £250.
