# From the Rector



#### Dear Friends,

It seems odd to be writing for the magazine before I have even arrived, but with the "copy" date being the 11th November, I'm actually sat in Manchester surrounded by cardboard boxes and bare walls wondering about Christmas, and how we will celebrate it, wondering how St. Cyprian's shares in Christmas, and whether our family will be together—a lot of uncertainties. By the time the magazine is printed many of those uncertainties will be resolved and I'm sure we will be happily settled in Lenzie.

I have also just read the last magazine, particularly Moira's letter, where she seems just a little too eager to hand this bit over to the new Rector!!!!! I've read several of her letters, all of which had great and important things to say, things which have showed the care and love she has for St. Cyprian's. It may be she chooses not to write stuff for every magazine, but I hope she continues to share the wisdom and care she has through these pages on a regular basis in the future.

This period has been a bit of an adventure—sorting out the future, unsure of how things will pan out, but knowing God is living the adventure with us. It has always been a link

I've made—advent and adventure. Advent—the period of coming; adventure—the exciting uncertain road that we may travel. But perhaps they are two side of the same coin.

For us there is the preparation for the coming of Jesus, anew each year. There is the preparation for Christmas—buying in the food, putting up the decorations, sending the cards........... But there is the preparation for the coming of Jesus—re-focusing our eyes on the stable, re-focusing our eyes on the seeds of the gospel planted in the Christmas story, coming to fruition in the death and resurrection of Jesus thirty years later, re-focusing our eyes on the characters, people like us, through whom God works to bring the glory of His Son alive in our world

Yet there is still the other side of the coin. Adventure. Christmas is God's great adventure. At Christmas God did something he had never done before. At Christmas God became a baby. God gave up all the power and glory and status of heaven to become a baby. It was an exciting uncertain road for God to take. The threats were real—from Herod in his murderous quest to retain his pride and power. Childbirth itself, and a less than hygienic environment. An era of childhood disease. An era of threat and darkness for the people of Israel.

# A message from Bishop Gregor

FOR the grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation to all ...

You may very well find yourself hearing these words from the second chapter of the letter to Titus, verse 11, being read in church at Christmas.

Titus 2.11-14 is among the set readings for Christmas. But I doubt very much that Titus lingers in the memory as St Luke and St John do at this time of the year.

And I think it would be fair to say that the letter to Titus is hardly the greatest work in the New Testament. It is largely concerned with what kind of people bishops ought to be—not arrogant or quick-tempered or a drunkard or violent or greedy for gain, but hospitable, a lover of goodness, etc (so some must have been not much good, really)—and with what they ought to be teaching to various groups within the Church. The Church, that is, in Crete, where the author of the letter is constrained to agree with the false teachers he

is tilting against and encouraging Titus to confute, that 'Cretans are always liars, vicious brutes, lazy gluttons'. A hard furrow to plough, it seems, for Titus, and a revealing take on how early Christian ministers might not always have loved their people.

But, thank God, in the midst of all that, the letter, to sustain hope in the face of such a daunting task, twice refers to what it calls the appearance of God: in the bit I quoted at the beginning the word grace is used, a little later on goodness and loving kindness.

The grace of God, the goodness and loving kindness of God have appeared. Elsewhere in what we know as the Pastoral Epistles (1 & 2 Timothy and Titus) it is always Christ who 'appears'. So, when both passages from Titus (2.11-14 and 3.4-7) are set for Christmas we are being invited to understand that the birth of Jesus, this baby laid in an animal's eating continued overleat

And these we find in Jesus. That is the ground of our prayer—that he be continually born in us, so that in us too, his followers, the grace and the goodness and the loving kindness of God are active for the renewal of the world. That is why we adore this little child every Christmastide.

organisation involved in such a move.

I thank you all for the friendship and kindness shown to me throughout my time with St Cyprian's.

I sincerely hope that many if not all of you will decide to visit me when I shall be delighted to show you my flat and take you around the complex.

# Through new eyes.....

As a new member of the community some times things strike you that maybe people of long-standing may take for granted. With that in mind, I thought it might be worth talking about some of

the impressions I get of Lenzie and Kirkintilloch in some articles over the coming few editions of the magazine. This time I want to talk about geese!

When in Manchester we occasionally got flocks of geese flying over, but they seem to be buzzing around a fair bit of the time over Lenzie. I've seen groups from 5 or 6 to well over

50 every day since we've been here. (I think the real name for a group of geese is a skein.) The groups have all been Canada Geese, and I love them, and love to see them and love to hear them. Sometimes the groups are silent, other times very noisy indeed.

Looking at the direction they are flying I guess they are coming from or going to the Gadloch, and it's not unusual for them to move from one patch of water to another around an area. It's wonderful to have them flying around.



If you were a member of the Celtic church, a church of coasts, fishing and farming, on some of the wetter, colder, windier areas of Europe, it can be difficult to relate to pictures in the bible, pictures such as a dove representing the Holy Spirit. How does the

picture make sense if you don't know what a dove is???? So the Celtic Christians rooted around for a bird to represent the Holy Spirit. They had a sense of what the Holy Spirit was and how the Holy Spirit worked, but what bird might represent that? And they chose the goose. Not the swooping or soaring gull, or the clown that is the puffin, or the power represented by the Eagle. They chose a goose. And it was a

great picture.


There is grace and beauty of the goose flying. There is the wildness of the sound drifting on the wind. There is the mystery, the unknown of the goose out of sight through the summer and dark nights of winter, often heard but not seen. There is the sheer un-inhibited liveliness of the way they live and relate to each other. There is the serenity of the goose floating on water, often with a family trailing behind.

The Goose is a wonderful representation of the Holy Spirit, God alive in our world. Beauty, grace, wildness, mystery, liveliness, serenity. It is all there in the Holy Spirit, working in the world. It is all represented by the goose, reminding us of the fabulous Holy Spirit alive in our lives and the world. Next time you see that flock of geese flying over, remember — seeing them can give us a glimpse, a reminder of the Holy Spirit which God gives to us.


# The Licensing
