Curate's Corner



Dear Friends,

It doesn't seem like a month since I was last sitting down to write a piece for Cyprian Life. Where does time go to? Sadly time seems to go all too quickly these days, especially when we reach the time for turning our clocks back and the nights seem to 'draw in'. By the time this goes to press, we will have entered into yet another season of Advent and the approach of Christmas.

I want to share with you some words from the introduction to an advent preparation study entitled "Immanuel - God With Us" by Anne Le Tissier, as they say so much about what this time of Advent is really all about. She says, "God came to be with us in human form; He comes to us today through the indwelling of the Holy Spirit; and Jesus is coming again as King and Lord of Lords. The angels were ecstatic at His arrival on earth, as were Simeon and Anna. His birth stirred shepherds to leave their flocks, and Magi to travel hundreds of miles to offer their precious gifts. His life of love attracted men and women to meet His human needs and serve God's kingdom purposes. This Immanuel longs to have an impact on our lives; that His presence may empower our lifestyles and thinking, and so protect our faith

from being hijacked by frenzied 'winter-fest mania'. The prophets prepared Israel to receive their future Saviour, the angel Gabriel prepared Mary for His birth, John the Baptist prepared His disciples to make Him known to the world. The baton has now been passed on to us - to prepare ourselves and our own generation to meet Immanuel."

One way in which we can prepare ourselves and others for this meeting of Immanuel in the season of Advent is to come along to the two Advent Meditation evenings which take place in the Choir Vestry on Thursday 10th and Thursday 17th December at 7pm and to invite along a friend. These two meditations will be a time to sit quietly and reflect on the true meaning of Christmas and to prepare ourselves for the coming of the Christ child. You won't be asked to do anything or to say anything, just to be there to focus on the story of Jesus' birth. Another way is of course to go along to the ACTS Advent Studies and support them, the second of which is here at St. Cyprian's. It is very important to ground ourselves in scripture and to see for ourselves just what it is that scripture is saying to us in our own lives.

Try to make these few weeks leading up to Christmas as peaceful and reflective as you can. Instead of rushing around worrying about

What's So Amazing about Grace?

Kentucky Companions

Recently returned from a visit to the Diocese of Kentucky, Gill Young recalls some highlights...

My three weeks in the USA were a work/holiday sandwich really; visiting Episcopalian friends in New York and Nashville framed an exciting time in our Companion Diocese of Kentucky.

In New York I met up with Gwyneth Leech, artist of our Cathedral frescos, and her family.

I started my Kentucky time in Paducah on the Ohio River, renewing acquaintance with some of the congregation of Grace Church with whom Gordon Fyfe and some of our young people made exchange visits in 2002.

One of those young folk is now in training for ordination and she and I met with members of the congregation.

Three days later I left for Louisville after a Civil War re-enactment day and a visit to New Harmony, an amazingly preserved old town, latterly owned by Robert Owen and very similar in intention to New Lanark.

In Kentucky I spent time at All Saints, the magnificent Diocesan Residential Centre, meeting with diocesan leaders involved in Christian formation and taking part in a skilfully led youth gathering.

Also staying that weekend were members of the diocesan search committee, for Kentucky is also in the process of electing a new bishop. We were able to compare notes and processes!

I was joined in Louisville by Anne and Elliott Glenesk and Bryan Owen from St James Bishopbriggs, and we met up with Sharon and Bob Nesmith and St Matthew's priest Lucinda Laird who visited us last year. Bob and Sharon gave us wonderful hospitality and we were treated to a tour of Louisville churches by former Bishop David. We saw some excellent children's work programmes, including Godly



Play, and visited their inspiring Memory Care Home.

On Sunday we joined the St Matthew's congregation for worship after which Bryan gave a presentation about Bishopbriggs, and the official link was established.

After lunch, Anne and Elliott joined many thousands of local people in a hunger march. Later that day there was a Celtic Eucharist where we met more of the congregation.

Then the Glasgow folk parted ways and I spent the morning in discussions at the diocesan centre. I met the Dean (Provost) of the Cathedral, Mark Bourlakas, with his assistant, Revd Amy Coultas; Canon Joan Smith (Dean of the Diocese); and the diocesan communications director Mary Jane Cherry.

The next day I had wide and helpful discussions with Canon Joan and the diocesan Christian formation leaders, sharing ideas and programmes.

Then on to stay with friends in Nashville, former American members of our St Mary's Cathedral, and spent the Sunday at their Anglican cathedral.

The churches I visited all seemed to major on Christian formation and adult education programmes, and the children's work was interesting, but of course their resources are greater. I look forward to sharing more of this visit at a later opportunity.

Filmfest Inspires Talks

Peter Andersson's news from our linked diocese, Gothenburg

A CINEMA festival was staged recently by two city parishes in Gothenburg, providing a forum to discuss existential matters.

The films were Waltz with Basher (on war in the Middle East); Juno (about a young girl dealing with her unplanned pregnancy); Forgiveness (about South Africa); blockbuster Mamma Mia; Crash (about a racism in Los Angeles); The Edge of Heaven (a physical and spiritual journey from Bremen to Istanbul); and a Swedish movie about being teenager.

Seminars and discussions were scheduled alongside the viewings.

TWELVE Jewish, Muslim and Christian young people visited Leicester at the end of October as a part of the project Youth Engagement in a Multifaith Society.

In Leicester together they visited among other things a synagogue, a mosque and a church



After the trip the group will share their experiences in different places.

THE General Synod of Church of Sweden decided at its meeting in October to accept same-sex marriage in the church and a supplement for such ceremonies will be added to the handbook for marriage services.

Three young delegates from Glasgow & Galloway participated in the All Saints Camp arranged by the youth organisation of Church of Sweden.

A SEMINAR on being the Church in the modern city was arranged in Gothenburg last month. Speakers included Christopher Baker (University of Manchester) and Dean Christoph Schuppan (Evangelical Lutheran Church, Berlin).

Chaplain of the ports

THE induction of Revd Timothy Tunley as Chaplain of the Scottish Ports was held on 9 November at St Mary's Church, Grangemouth.

The Most Reverend David Chillingworth, Primus, and Liaison Bishop for The Mission to Seafarers in Scotland, officiated at the service. Chaplain Tim will be based in Grangemouth, and will extend his ministry to other ports.

During the proceedings the Reverend Allan Boyd was appointed Chaplain Emeritus. He had served until recently as Honorary Chaplain for Glasgow and the Clyde, a position he had held since 1989.

Prior to that he served for 20 years as a volunteer in various capacities. Following the appointment by the Reverend Tom Heffer, Secretary General of the Mission to Seafarers, the congregation responded with a standing ovation

The Mission to Seafarers is a missionary society of the Anglican Church that serves seafarers around the world.



World Aids Day 2009

1st December is World Aids Day and across the world organisations and people are making a difference by raising public awareness and breaking down the unwanted stigma that surrounds HIV/AIDS.

World Aids day is about reminding people that HIV has not gone away and that there are many things still to be done. Read below how Mothers' Union through its parenting programme is helping tackle the issues surrounding this epidemic and mobilizing communities to help themselves.

Mothers' Union members in Kenya have long since identified the issues surrounding the HIV/AIDS epidemic; poor parenting, early marriages and lack of education particularly for girls. Mothers' Union Parenting Programme has empowered voluntary members of the community to now do something about it themselves.

In Mumias diocese, Kenya Province, have been tackling parenting groups HIV/AIDS through community-based and led training, which has been funded by the Anglican Relief and Development Foundation Kenya, in collaboration with the Ministry of Health. The project began as a post-parenting initiative, after volunteer facilitators had identified the local need for further knowledge and education to be at hand within their communities, which are seeing HIV/AIDS spreading at an alarming rate and leaving child-headed households behind.

Mothers' Union parenting group facilitators were trained in HIV/AIDS awareness, after which parenting groups were set-up with an added capacity allowing them to reach out to those effected by HIV/AIDS. Specific groups are now set up by all facilitators who attended the training, including groups made up of all widows. One widow stated that before coming to the group, both she and her children had not eaten for two days...Parents have now said "they are ready and want to learn more on how to take care of their children" Malishira parenting group, Mumias diocese, Kenya.

Out of 440 people who are now part of the HIV/AIDS specific awareness parenting groups, 200 have been for voluntary counselling and testing. 40 people have since stood to declare their positive status to the groups in order that they can educate all on the causes, effects and support needed.

A Prayer for Christian Unity from MU Resources for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity 2010



'Enough for All' message

This is the theme for next year's Poverty & Homeless Action Week

The week runs from Homeless Sunday (30 January) to Poverty Action Sunday (7 February) with churches holding special services, organising sleep-outs, and celebrating their work to help and highlight the plight of the homeless and poor.

The theme is inspired by Luke 9.12: "All of them ate and were filled. When they collected the leftover pieces, there were 12 baskets."

A spokesman said: "The recession is not just a crisis but also a time for us to explore new ways of doing things.

"We have had enough of an economic system built on greed and selfishness. There is another way.

"There is a growing gap between rich and poor. This is not only immoral; it is bad for all of us, harming our health and happiness. But we can close the gap.

"There is enough for all. Enough food, enough resources, enough money, enough homes, enough love, enough joy.

"But there is only enough if we don't retreat into our shells. We must greet our neighbours, give what we can and share our ideas, hopes and skills.

"Our churches and communities contain a wealth of skill and resources, including many we don't know about yet. We must rediscover and share them"
