Curate's Corner



Dear Friends,

At the time of writing this, 1 have just returned from holiday last week and I am still not quite back into the swing of things, but I do want to wish everyone a healthy and blessed year in 2012.

Easter is a little early this year and we will be celebrating Ash Wednesday on the 22^{nd} February with a service at 7.30pm and the imposition of ashes.

During the period of Lent this year, we hope to be able to offer some Bible Study in the Choir Vestry so that we might prepare ourselves for Holy Week and Easter and I am looking at some Lenten books along with Glennis to see what is available. I do hope that everyone will try to make time during Lent to support the Bible Study when they can.

Lent is a good time to renew our commitment to Christ and to get ourselves into a regular routine of prayer and coming closer to God. Sometimes it is good to set ourselves a challenge during Lent and instead of giving up something that we usually enjoy, but might not be good for us, it can be more rewarding actually to commit to doing something for the good of ourselves or for the good of others.

One year I challenged myself to read the

whole of the Bible in one year, beginning at Lent. I signed up to an email scheme which advised three portions of the Bible to read each day until the whole Bible was read through. It didn't begin at Genesis and end at Revelation, but was more a themed set of readings for each day, which made it more interesting, though I have to admit that I found all the facts and figures in 1st and 2nd Kings rather tedious (and still do). However, it was a worthwhile exercise and helped to maintain a discipline of setting aside time each morning to read scripture and reflect on the passages I was reading.

Last week the Pastoral Visiting Group met and we have shared out the names of those we are praying for on our prayer list amongst us and have committed to praying for these people in our daily prayers. If there are others you would like to have prayed for but perhaps don't want to put them in the Link, let me know and the Pastoral Group will include them

Please remember that I am available anytime if anyone wants to speak with me and do let me know if you hear of anyone who is ill

There are three dates, each allocated to one or more of the diocesan regions.



Bishop's Lent Appeal

THE beneficiary of this year's Bishop's Lent appeal is Waverley Care, a charity which has, for 21 years, been providing care and support to people who are living with or affected by HIV.

In many ways, the nature of HIV has changed. It is no longer a terminal condition and, with the right treatment and support, people can live relatively normal lives. What hasn't changed, however, is the stigma of HIV. Those who live with HIV live with the added burden of secrecy, with both adults and children being unable to confide in friends or neighbours for fear of being judged or victimised. People live in constant fear of others finding out. The impact of stigma on emotional and spiritual health is profound.



This is where Waverley Care's work can make such a difference. The charity is there to provide support to everyone whose lives are affected by HIV. They work with adults and children from across every sector of society.

HIV doesn't discriminate; anyone can be affected. Through one-to-one and group support, Waverley Care can turn lives around, rebuilding self-confidence and helping people to know that they are valued, loved and cared for

Good Turnout for Advent Quiet Day

The Diocesan Quiet Day for Advent was held on Saturday 10th December 2011 in two venues: Holy Trinity & St Barnabas, Paisley and St Ninian's, Castle Douglas.

Thirty people gathered in Paisley, where Bishop Gregor gave a fascinating insight in to the very different lives of three great Anglicans—George Herbert, John Newton and George Bell. Each of these reflections was followed by a period of silence.

The Eucharist was celebrated in the church.

and this was followed by fellowship over lunch before returning to quiet mode for the last session.

The day started and ended with Morning and Evening Prayer from the Prayer Book.

About 20 people at Castle Douglas enjoyed the Quiet Day led by Bishop Gordon Mursell, whose theme was: 'Preparing for Christmas—Prayer in Advent'. There, the Eucharist was celebrated by Canon David Bayne and lunch was enhanced by contributions of home-made soup.

Journey in Faith course:

Trinity and Church

This six-week evening course, from the Diocesan Education Action Group, follows on from Journey in Faith Unit 1, but participants who have not done Unit 1 will also be welcome.

The sessions are offered at two locations: Holy Trinity Kilmarnock (led by Prof David Jasper on Tuesdays) and St Margaret's Newlands (led by Bishop Gregor on Wednesdays).

The first three nights cover:

- God the Father as Creator and Judge—including the problem of evil
- God the Son: Who is Jesus—divine and human?
- God the Holy Spirit: Who is the Holy Spirit? What does the Holy Spirit do? Sessions 4 and 5 explore:
- The development of the early Church up to the end of the patristic period
- How the SEC came into being
- What a church is—by looking at different contemporary models of church.

Session 6 deals with God's call to the Church and to us as individuals.

The course runs from 17/18 April to 21/22 May.

Addiction remembrance

A service of remembrance for those who had died as a result of addiction proved a moving occasion last December at St Augustine's Dumbarton. Rector Kenny Macaulay reports...

THE church was fairly full with mothers, fathers, brothers, sisters, friends and caseworkers of young people who had died as a result of drug misuse, and of people who had died as a result of alcoholism.

Everyone was given the chance to name someone they had lost, and light a candle in their memory. There was a lot of healing and some closure going on.

The liturgy flowed well, and ended by remembering those still suffering on the streets and at home, with a great feeling and message of hope for all.

Afterwards we had coffee, tea and eats in

the hall, where we were joined by a large gang of Narcotics Anonymous folk in recovery. That certainly gladdened the heart!

Hopefully, it will only be the first one of these services, and it will become an annual event in the town

There were 18 drug-related deaths in West Dunbartonshire in 2011 alone. Unfortunately that number will be added to as the weeks and months and years progress.

A book of remembrance has been started, and it will be housed in St Augustine's.

Nothing can be done without drama at St Aug's, however, and after everyone was safely in the community hall blethering, the candles on the table at the front of the altar exploded into a huge flame.

A large dollop of baptismal water was used to 'pit it oot'!

Worth doing? Certainly!

Drumming and dance in the Cathedral

Known affectionately as 'Chucks' to friends and colleagues, Revd Chukwuemeka Iwuagwu was ordained priest by Bishop Gregor on the Festival of the Epiphany in St Mary's Cathedral.

For the past year, Chucks has served as non-stipendiary curate at the Cathedral, and that church was filled with a large crowd to witness, and participate in, his ordination to the priesthood. Chucks will continue to serve on the Cathedral team.






and Richard Lord's 'View me, Lord'.

We look forward to visiting again in February.



Future Ministry at St Cyprian's

You may be wondering where we are in our search for a new leader to take St Cyprian's forward into the future.

There has been quite a lot of activity over the last 5 or 6 months, but unfortunately not a lot to show for it

We advertised in the Church Times and Inspires both on paper and online back in September. Although there was some interest and one formal application, the Vestry after extensive discussion and careful consideration in consultation with the Bishop decided that the applicant did not have the qualities we were looking for and had been specified in our Parish Profile. This was unfortunate, but the Vestry does not regret the decision and believes it was in the best interests of the congregation as a whole.

We advertised again during November

2011. This time there were one or two expressions of interest, but no applications.

The Vestry met with the Bishop on 23rd January 2012 to discuss the situation. We are all feeling some degree of disappointment and frustration that our efforts so far have come to nothing. The Bishop reassured us that we had done everything right in the quest so far. There was some discussion about other alternatives perhaps through linkage or lay ministry, but the primary focus remains on trying to appoint a full-time priest.

The Bishop is going to discuss the matter with the College of Bishops during their meeting at the beginning of February and hopes (but cannot guarantee) to come back to the Vestry with definite proposals at a meeting scheduled for 20th February 2012. In the meantime please pray for all involved.
