From Our Interim Priest-in-Charge



Dear Friends,

Rarely have I felt so uncertain about this year we have now entered. There seems way more instability than usual in our national and international systems and, given the record of early 2020 and 2021, all bets are off that there's not something else coming down the track. Or perhaps October 7th was that and it just came early. Or maybe it is the metastatic fall-out from that day which will dominate early 2024.

And yet I am reminded of the prayer in the mid-eighteenth century by John Wesley and



since become an integral part of the Methodist Community's life.

I am no longer my own but yours. Put me to what you will, rank me with whom you will; put me to doing. put me to suffering; *let me be employed for you.* or laid aside for you, exalted for you, or brought low for you; let me be full. let me be empty. let me have all things. let me have nothing: I freely and wholeheartedly vield all things to your pleasure and disposal. And now, glorious and blessed God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, you are mine and I am yours. So be it. And the covenant now made on earth. let it be ratified in heaven.

Such a prayer can do very little about the circumstances of Gaza, Israel, Ukraine, *Continued overleaf*

Friends of the Holy Land is an ecumenical Christian Charity inspired by the message of Jesus, a message that still today brings hope to millions of people around the world and was first heard in and around what is now Israel, the West Bank, Jordan and Gaza.

So many Christians have had their lives completely destroyed by this war, either directly for those in Gaza or indirectly for those in the the West Bank and Israel. Tourism has shut down, work permits have been withdrawn, many Christians have lost their ability to make a living. Friends of the Holy Land helps with emergency support and projects to help them rebuild a sustainable future to remain in the Holy Land.

Vacancy Update

Following a break over the Christmas period, the Vestry met on 14th January, and after discussion, have agreed the following actions, as part of the process towards appointing a new Rector:

- Maxine, as Treasurer, will draft the required financial planning document, which has to be submitted to the diocese. This document asks for information about our current finances, and the budgeted costs associated with appointing a new Rector.
- A small group (Paul, Gavin and Sally) will look at the example template for a parish profile provided by the Scottish Episcopal Church, and also at our profile from the last vacancy, with a view to drawing up the draft outline for a new and current parish profile.

- The Vestry will consider this draft, arrange various communication methods/meetings to invite and enable contributions from everyone, and source other information that may be helpful.
- The Vestry will revisit our "Bricks without Straw document" to use as part of this process.
- The Vestry will also start planning to make a video about St Cyprian's, again involving everyone who wishes to contribute.

Both the Parish Profile and the video are used as part of the process of advertising the vacancy.

We are hoping to make significant progress by early summer, so as you will appreciate, the next few weeks are certainly going to be busy! Please continue to pray for this process and all involved in this.
