# Dear Friends,

Now and again (actually very occasionally), Valentine's Day falls on Ash Wednesday. This is one of those years and it got me thinking that, although at first glance the two may seem totally unrelated, actually Valentine's Day can help us observe Lent in the right spirit.

Valentine's Day celebrates the love one person has for another and although this can



range from a schoolboy crush to the mature love of a long married couple there is a common theme. The 'secret' identity of the giver of the Valentine Card not only adds an air of mystery and excitement, but it also, if properly observed, means that it is offered expecting nothing in return. At heart, it is altruistic.

We usually approach Lent as a season when we give things up, a time of sacrifice and penance as we walk with Jesus on the road to Jerusalem and his death for us. It is in foregoing some of our normal habits and luxuries that we become more conscious of what he gave up for us and are reminded that being his disciple means taking up our own cross and following him. We also become more oriented towards the needs of others and the injustices in the world, following Jesus' example. This annual journey is an important time for us.

Speaking for myself, though, I know that I can become focused too much on what I am giving up and forget that Lent can be an expression of my love for Jesus and gratitude for what he has done for me. Lent can also be

The local service will be held at St David's Memorial Park Church in Kirkintilloch at 1.30pm on Friday 1st March.


Palestine's involvement with the World Day of Prayer movement has allowed Palestinian women to build bridges with over 100 countries around the world. After thirty years since last doing so, Palestine has been invited to write the resource materials for 2024. This invitation comes at a challenging time, when the ongoing injustice has not stopped. It is a time of reflection, self-analysis and living what we believe in. The path is long, but Palestinian women continue to serve as instruments for a better and deeper understanding among the peoples who share this land, trusting and hoping in the humanity of one another.

### Signs of Hope

Despite all the suffering and injustice in the land of the Holy One, Palestinians have shown *sumud* (steadfastness) through mostly nonviolent resistance. There is a genuine effort among Palestinian Christians, Muslims, and some Jews, who believe in equal rights, and who advocate and work for justice.

We call upon you, sisters and brothers in every part of the world, to bear with us in love. We call upon you to unite your prayers with ours, for a just and peaceful solution that would bring an end to all human suffering and achieve security and peace for all people around the world.


# **Holy Week & Easter Services**

There are many reasons why someone may feel lonely – loss of a partner, depression, poor health, feelings of rejection, deafness - the list is fairly substantial. As a result, there may be feelings of worthlessness, a lack of confidence, lethargy, to name a few. Many of us will feel lonely at some point in our lives, even when part of a busy environment, and can relate to many of our thoughts from that day. We did decide, however, that both churches are already aware of those who may feel alone and will ensure that a greater effort will be made to keep in contact with everyone in our congregations. We also decided that joint meetings are a way forward and we should have more of them.







Our February Branch meeting also proved very enlightening. Roddy Young (*left*), a Rotarian friend of Glennis's, gave a very interesting slide show and talk about his trip to Tanzania and climbing Kilimanjaro. Roddy is a member of the Glasgow Guild of Maltmen, and as such is involved in raising funds to support people who would like to gain qualifications for the hospitality industry. He had obviously enjoyed this fundraising trip and talked about the people he had encountered, the six day hike to the top of the mountain, an the incredible physical challenge, and the flora and fauna they encountered.

March 13th will be our next meeting where

we will be holding reflections for this time of Lent. Mothers' Union has issued a Family Lent Calendar and we will try some of the activities listed and discuss these in more detail at our meeting.

RISE UP Against Domestic Abuse is Mothers' Union's new campaign to raise awareness about domestic abuse.

Our aim is to make sure that activism against domestic abuse

and gender-based violence happens 365 days a year and not just during the 16 Days of Activism campaign in November and December.

The letters of RISE UP stand for Respond, Inform, Support, Empower, Unite and Pray.

We are working with our members to ensure that as many churches as possible have information about their local domestic abuse helpline.

Domestic abuse can happen to anyone from any walk of life. It isn't just unemployed, single parents who suffer from abuse. It is the educated, the affluent, both women and men. It can happen to anyone. Abuse can and does happen anywhere. Unfortunately some people hide behind miscommunicated Bible passages to justify their actions or feel like they should stay with an abusive partner. We want to raise awareness that this not OK.

There are bronze, silver and gold awards for branches and churches who take part and complete various actions.

# **Vacancy Update**

The Vestry has continued to meet regularly as a whole and in sub-groups to progress the production of the Parish Profile and the accompanying video as well as looking at the practicalities such as our finances and the preparation of the Rectory to receive a new priest. So far, we can report that:

- We have produced a draft profile that is to be discussed in the Congregational meeting held on the day this magazine is published. This will be updated following the meeting and, depending on feedback, may result in a further congregational meeting to agree on the final text.
- The Finance and Property Group has met to assist Maxine, as Treasurer, to draft the required financial planning document,

- which has to be submitted to the diocese. This document asks for information about our current finances, and the budgeted costs associated with appointing a new Rector. We also need to look at projections for the future and report on our financial history.
- Alongside the profile there is now a list of ideas for the content of the video. We'll be looking for people to take part, so don't be shy! Having seen a few example of other church's videos, it's the contributions of the people that really matter.
- A team from the Vestry with community payback support from the local council has started the refurbishment of the Rectory.

We have made significant progress with the aim of being able to advertise in May. Please continue to pray for this process and all involved in it.
