From Our Priest-in-Charge



Dear Ones,

My grandfather was a farmer. Some of my fondest childhood memories come from autumn time at my grandparents house.



In late August and all throughout September, we would gather in the fields after grandpa had bailed the hay and we'd walk behind his pickup truck collecting the heavy rectangular bundles and heaving them up to whomever got the coveted job of stacking the bales in the back of the truck. Then, when the truck was stacked high – some might even say "too high" – we got to climb up onto the pile where we would sit as the truck rambled home from the fields to store the hay to feed the cows over the winter.

One of the times that I feel most at home in Scotland is when I start seeing the huge, round haybales appearing in the fields. The low, golden sun shining over the fields in the last stretch before the darkness of winter always raises a sense of awe in my heart.

As we prepare to celebrate Harvest, I hope we can take stock not only of the seasonal bounty, but our communal bounty as well. The generosity, hospitality, and joy that we share with one another here at St. Cyprian's is a harvest of the abundance of God's grace. At Harvest we are called upon to celebrate all that we have grown and gathered – and then to

In Memory of Audrey Groom

15th April 1937 - 1st September 2025

Many of you will, I'm sure, remember Audrey. The photo here was taken when she was, as she often did, helping at an event in the Church Hall. The following appreciation was provided by the family.

Audrey Rita Groom was aged 88 when she passed away peacefully on September 1st, 2025, at Wishaw General Hospital.

Audrey was born in London in 1937. She spent her early years in the London area where she married Bernard Arthur Groom, with whom she shared a rich and loving life (Bernard died in April 2007 and there was a short appreciation in the May/June 2007 issue of Cyprian*Life*). Audrey was a loving wife, devoted mother of three sons: Andrew, Stuart, and the late Richard, and a talented homemaker. This talent probably faced the biggest challenge when the family moved to Glasgow in 1974. Audrey was their rock and helped them all through a difficult adjustment to a very different life in Scotland.

We knew her here at St. Cyprian's for many years until, following Bernard's death, she demonstrated a strength of character and desire to continue to enjoy life by moving to Auchlochan Garden Village where she made many new close and dear friends.

She is survived by Andrew and Stuart, three grandchildren, Sarah Groom, Anna Smith, Lucy Groom and five great grandchildren, Rory, Finlay, Blair, Jude and Ronnie who will forever cherish her quiet strength, creativity, and warmth.

Audrey and Bernard recognized and encouraged their three sons' different personalities and continued to support them all throughout their lives. They were both



extremely proud of their sons and delighted to welcome two daughters-in-law to the family, Veronica and Sally.

In her own words, Audrey had an "exciting, eventful and interesting life". Audrey and Bernard enjoyed travelling, visiting many countries in Europe and making numerous trips to the USA and Canada.

Known for her skilful hands and artistic spirit, Audrey found great joy in gardening, dressmaking, and sewing. Her garden was often filled with blooming flowers and wonderful plants. Audrey skilfully made many dresses for herself and others, each made with love and care.

Those close to her will remember her gentle nature, her resilience, and the way she brought comfort and beauty into the lives of others. She will be deeply missed by family, friends, and all who had the privilege to know her. Her funeral was held on Monday 22nd September 2025 at Daldowie Crematorium followed by a reception at The Douglas Suite in Auchlochan Garden Village, Lesmahagow,


The family kindly suggests donations to Operation Smile UK, a local hospice, or a charity in her memory.

New Miscellany

New Role for Rev. Audrey

No sooner was Rev. Audrey licensed as Priest-in-Charge here at Lenzie than the Bishop asked her to serve as Interim Priest-in-Charge at St. James the Less, Bishopbriggs.

She expects to offer them a similar pattern of cover as Paul Watson had given to St. Cyprian's, i.e. a Sunday every other month, a monthly Thursday Eucharist, and home communions and other pastoral care as the need arises. She has already undertaken her first funeral in this role.

She is also planning to offer Advent and Lent programmes to both churches (see page 7 for more about the Advent programme).

She also wants to consider if there may be other ways we can support both charges by working together during the Bishopbriggs vacancy. This is an exciting opportunity for both churches.

Blue Christmas/ Longest Night Service

For those who were bereaved at Christmastime, the joyous celebrations around them can be very difficult to cope with.

As you can read on page 7, we are considering holding events during Advent to recognise the difficulty some of our members face.

Child-friendly Church

The Vestry is supporting Rev. Audrey's wishes to explore how children could be better catered for in the church. You may well spot various changes as she experiments with what might work.

There won't be any permanent changes until we do find out what is helpful to our young people.

Server's Training

Rev. Audrey would like to offer this to all existing servers and anyone else who might like to be involved.

We would like to encourage children to be involved, so we may need to require adult servers to join the PVG scheme, especially if they are involved in training the children, in order to satisfy our legal obligations.

Communications Survey

Whenever somebody new arrives, it presents the opportunity to look at how we currently do things and whether they are 'fit for purpose' as the jargon goes.

To this end Rev. Audrey is planning to send a brief communications survey to the congregation to canvas opinion on what is the best plan for communications in future.

You may have a view on the relevance of this magazine and how frequently it should be produced. Is the current content of interest to you and what would you change? We hope to have made a decision on that in time for the next issue.

We currently send out an email each week to provide the link to the online service, prayer intentions and the latest information about upcoming events. It's encouraging that it is opened by the majority of recipients and there is a very low unsubscribe rate. That doesn't mean it's perfect. How could it be improved or would you miss it if it wasn't produced? Should we concentrate on it and reduce the magazine?

What other communication methods would you favour. Would a congregational Facebook group or a WhatsApp group be of interest? Do you read the local newspaper? Is it worth putting some effort into it?
