From Our Priest-in-Charge



Beloved in Christ,

Alleluia (almost!)

Holy Week is upon us and, as we join in the long walk to Calvary, we cannot help but to anticipate the light that is to come. This almost/but not yet dichotomy that is inherent in this week of witness is such a challenging tension in which to live. We have the privilege of knowing the rest of the story which makes it far too easy to skip over the pain in anticipation of the glory. It is much more desirable to live with the chocolate eggs and lilies, rather than the crown of thorns and the cracking of the whip. But that is what we are called to do. We are called to live in the middle – knowing both the pain and the glory.

Our world feels a lot like Good Friday right now. Wars, genocide, racism, and pain are inescapable. But one thing we must remind ourselves, is that we are an Easter people – we are a people who know that even in the darkest of times there is light. As Barbara Brown Taylor wrote in her book *Learning the Walk in the Dark*, “New life starts in the dark. Whether it is a seed in the ground, a baby in the womb, or Jesus in the tomb, it starts in the dark.” And one thing to which I cling when it feels like the darkness might be closing in – we are called to be light bearers in this broken world. As a people who know the hope and promise of the resurrection we are called to bring our light and our hope into this world that God made and loves.

So in this season when hope can feel too high a bar, our challenge is to become that hope. In times when we are looking for light, what would it be like for us to embrace and become the light? In the small things we do – a smile, a hug, a word of encouragement – they all could be the thing that turns the day around for someone who could, in turn, become a light on their own.

So yes, I am already saying Alleluia – perhaps quietly and on my own, but I am

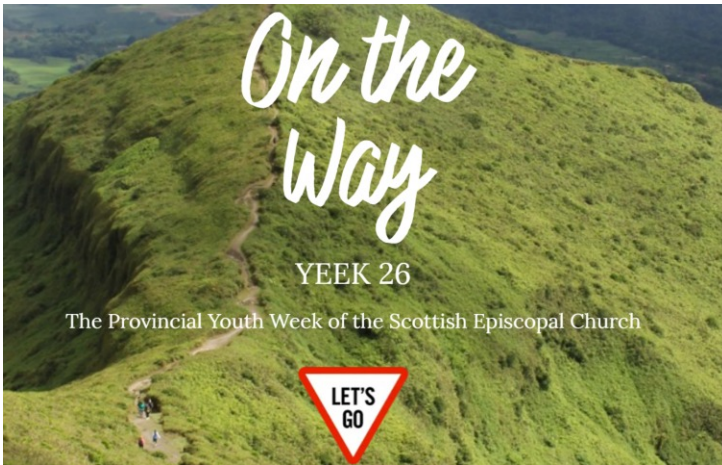
Provincial Youth Week “YEEK!”

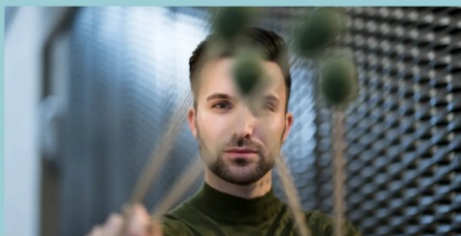

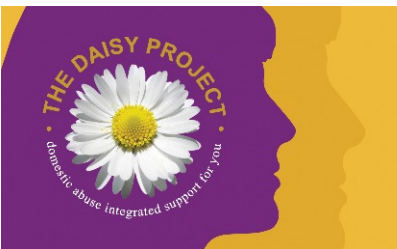
course we could not open them to check on their state so we left it to the recipients to check.
