From Our Priest-in-Charge



Dear Friends in Christ,

I have been thinking a lot about intentionality lately. It has come in the midst of planning for the summer school holidays with my family. We don't have a formal holiday planned, and I hadn't given much thought to what the girls were going to do while my spouse and I are working.

A couple of weeks ago, I sat down and booked the girls into various classes and camps for about half of the break. I decided that I don't want to overschedule them, so we'll be winging it for the other half.

I was struggling with making plans for the summer when I decided to sit down and make a list of the things I want to do. My list started out simply enough:

- I want joyful movement in my days.
 - I want to spend time being creative.
 - I want to play.
 - I want to spend time outside.
 - I want to unplug.
 - I want to take the girls camping.
- But then it took a turn:
- I want to paint the living room.
 - I want to get the recycling out of the garage and off to the tip.
 - I want to sort the girls' clothes.
 - I want to buy a new vacuum.

At some point, my list of hopes became a to-do list.

That's how life is sometimes. We go into things with the best intentions and then, without consciously making a choice, we shift from choice to obligation, from joy to duty.

Now, I'm not saying there isn't joy to be found in completing a task. (I will be over the moon when I get those giant boxes out of the way!) What I am saying is that there can be a slippery slope between doing things because we find joy in the finished project and doing things because the need-to-do list becomes louder than the want-to-do list.

As I have sat with this idea in my planning, a hymn has come to mind:

*Take my life and let it be
consecrated, Lord, to thee.
Take my moments and my days;
let them flow in endless praise,
let them flow in endless praise.*

The line that has been centred in my thoughts is: "Take my moments and my days..."

What does it look like to give our moments and days over to God? Is God more pleased with my hours of doom-scrolling or with picking wildflowers? Will my soul gain more from painting the living room or from playing at the seaside?

Sea Sunday

Sea Sunday is a Sunday set aside in the church calendar as a time to pray for our seafarers and to give thanks for their crucial work. It is marked on Sunday 12th July this year.

There are two major Scottish charities dedicated to supporting seafarers around the world: The Sailors' Society Scotland and the Mission to Seafarers Scotland.

The Sailors' Society Sea Sunday 2026 theme is 'With them in every storm'. It reminds us that this has been a particularly difficult year for our seafarers, the men and women who bring us more than 90 per cent of everything we own and use.

We've all seen the news about the Strait of Hormuz and how this often-invisible workforce has been trapped at sea for months on end. The ships have not been allowed to dock or transit the strait for fear of being attacked.

The Society wants to tell us the lived stories behind the headlines and the work it is doing to support seafarers and their families.

The stories are heartbreaking, but this is just a snapshot of the daily isolation and crises that all seafarers may face.

This year, they have returned to the miracle story of Jesus calming the storm from St Mark's Gospel, as they feel it perfectly illustrates the work they do calming the storms in the lives of our seafarers and their families.

'With them in every storm' isn't just a mission statement, it is a daily reality for their team of chaplains and crisis responders.

The Mission to Seafarers, colloquially known as the Flying Angels, has its roots in the work of Anglican priest, John Ashley who in 1835 was on the shore at Clevedon with his son who asked him how the people on ships in the Bristol Channel could go to church. He recognised the need and created the Bristol



Channel Mission. His fundraising led, in 1839, to a specially designed mission cutter named Eirene being built with a main cabin that could be converted into a chapel for 100 people.

His work inspired similar ministries in the UK. In 1856, these groups formally organised and two years later became The Mission to Seamen. About eight years ago, it renamed to The Mission to Seafarers. The Mission now operates 121 centres around the world.

The Mission's 2026 theme is 'Harbours of Hope: The Church Alongside Seafarers' inspired by Matthew 25. It celebrates the local church as a place of welcome, refuge, and hope — a community offering both spiritual and practical safety to those who work at sea. It invites us to reflect on how we can stand alongside seafarers through prayer, hospitality, generosity, and justice.

The Mission to Seafarers Scotland works throughout Scotland caring for seafarers of all ranks, nationalities and beliefs. Scotland has over 90 ports and although the Mission does not have a permanent presence at every port it can be contacted by phone, email or Facebook any time day or night. Its service has one full time Chaplain and a band of ship visiting volunteers accredited by the Merchant Navy Welfare Board (MNWB). Together they offer practical, emotional and spiritual support to seafarers through ship-visits and a seafarers' centre in Grangemouth. In addition, many other volunteers throughout the country knit woolly hats that are so valued by seafarers from warmer climates.

Our Afternoon Tea at Caulder's, Kirkintilloch went well and was enjoyed by all who could manage along. Having one of the small rooms was a definite plus as it made it a more private experience.



On the day this magazine is published, Sunday 28th June, we are holding our 150th Anniversary Take Over Service when our

members help with the service and we sing the new MU Hymn for the first time. Hope you are/were there that day!

Plans for our 2026/27 season are coming together and will be published once dates and speakers have been confirmed.

Plans for our 150th Anniversary Fundraiser

are now well under way so this is a date for your Diary. We will be holding a Victorian Family Afternoon on Saturday 22nd August from 2-4 pm. Afternoon tea will be served in the main hall and there will be Victorian themed children's games and crafts to try out.

Our regular meetings will resume in September so watch out for more information nearer the time.

Luke's Confirmation



It was a joyful day for the congregation as we welcomed Bishop Nick to St. Cyprian's on Sunday 3rd May, the first anniversary of his consecration as Bishop of Glasgow and Galloway, for the Service of Confirmation.

In his sermon, the Bishop recognised that St. Cyprian's is a church on the move, but warned us to watch out for the inevitable opposition that comes with that and asked us to pray for one another and stay united.

He had some gifts for Luke. The first was a holding cross to hold onto at times of difficulty. Next, he asked Luke to pick a stone at random from his bag of stones with words written on them. The stone Luke picked had



'gratitude'. The Bishop promised to pray for Luke during the confirmation that whatever he faces in life he will have a spirit of thankfulness. It is so good for keeping us in good mental health in times of trial.

Luke then took the next step in his Christian life by renewing his baptismal promises and affirming his faith supported by his family, many of whom had come from Ireland especially for the service.

After the Eucharist, we had a little ceremony to mark the Bishop's first anniversary with the presentation of a caterpillar cake adorned by a number one candle and accompanied by the singing of 'Happy Bishopaversary'!

After that, we adjourned to the hall for lunch with all sort of food including Irish soda bread made by Luke's grandmother, which went down very well!
