From Our Priest-in-Charge

Beloved in Christ,

A couple of weeks ago I was in the kitchen, preparing breakfast at the start of what would be another long summer day, when one of the girls came in with a big question. She asked, “Mommy, see how you said there’s no room for fear in love? Why did you say that? I don’t think that’s true because I love, but I have other feelings too like fear and anxiety. I think you can have more than one feeling at a time.”

You could have knocked me over with a feather. After my sleep haze began to wear off, and the caffeine started to kick in, I realized she was talking about that point in our liturgy – at the confession – when I stand at the front and say “God is love and we are God’s children. There is no room for fear in love. We love because God loves us first...”

I honestly can’t remember the entirety of what I said in that moment. A part of it was, “That’s a really good question. Can I have a think and get back to you?”, but the other thing I remember saying was that while we have the capacity of multitudes within the feelings that we hold, when it comes to love, we have to be brave. We might feel love and feel scared, but

we have to choose to be brave because when we allow fear to hold us back, then our whole self isn’t present within the love that we are aiming to share.

At our most recent vestry meeting, I shared with the Vestry a grant application I put together to help fund some of the refurbishment in the hall. After much prayer, I ended up calling the project for the purposes of the application “Saint Cyprian’s for All”. The

When I worked with the Vestry on a redesign of our logo almost a year ago, the tag lines we put underneath the outline of our beautiful rose window are “All are welcome - All are loved” and that has been my guiding star for all of the decisions that I’ve made over the past year as your priest. “How will this decision help others to feel welcome and loved?”

Over the next few months, the Vestry will be working hard putting in a Canon 35 application so that we can permanently implement the change to the location of our altar, which is both to improve accessibility as well as highlighting our theology of welcome. We will be continuing work in the hall, which will hopefully make our stage, once again, an asset that can be used by the community. And we will be dreaming and scheming about where the Spirit is calling us.

Change can be scary. It can force us to look into a mirror and reevaluate everything that we see. It can also be exciting, like when we

welcome new people through the doors on a Sunday morning. It is okay to have many feelings at the same time because we have the capacity for multitudes. We are children of the living God.

I look forward to finding out what the next year in ministry together has in store for us and the ways that God will use us even when we feel fearful because God is love and we are God’s children. There is no room for fear in love. We love because God loved us first.

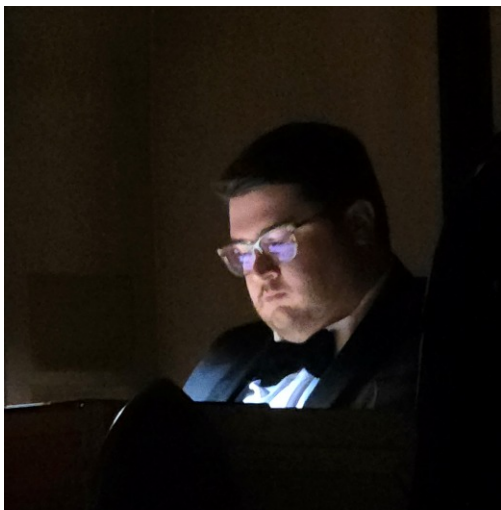

My Experience at YEEK

This year, I signed up for YEEK. I had never been before, so I wasn't really sure what to expect. I have been going to Scripture Union camps since I was nine years old.

My family have only been attending the Scottish Episcopal Church for about a year. During that time, I had been questioning whether this was the right church home for me.

I decided to go to YEEK because it seemed like a good opportunity to meet other young people, have fun and experience something different.

On the first day, we had a worship service. I really enjoyed the singing, especially hearing the more talented singers singing the hymns. The camp was very inclusive and friendly, and the food was yummy! I also made friends and it's nice to have other young Christian friends to snapchat with.

During the week we had a ceilidh and a disco in the evenings, which was great fun and gave us the chance to do some dancing. During

the day there were lots of different activities. I took part in sports, where I played football, and I also signed up for cheese tasting. I didn't realise what I had signed up for because I don't even like cheese — I just ate the crackers! 😊 Even though I didn't enjoy the cheese, it was still good fun because I got the chance to talk to other people.

We also had house groups during the week, where we explored different things about God. This year's theme was "On Your Way". During our house group sessions, I learnt more about how I am on a journey with God.

We did lots of team-building activities, and our house group also put together a service. We showed a video that our group had made about how sometimes it is better to take the long way rather than the short way, and to follow God's plan because He has something in store for you. I even had to act in the video!

We also went for a walk, and while we were outside I felt a sense of God being with me. It was very peaceful being outdoors and taking in the beautiful scenery.



Backpack Blessing

On Sunday 16th August, just the day before our children and young people returned back to school, Rev Audrey did a very special blessing of all our backpacks, briefcases, lunch bags, handbags etc.,

There were also tags for everyone to attach to their bags,



and spares for family and friends. Hopefully, pupils, parents, carers, teachers and everyone else involved, had a very blessed first day back!"

✍ I particularly enjoyed the worship services, which we had twice every day. There were prayers, singing and time to reflect, and I really enjoyed these. They gave me a better insight into the Scottish Episcopal Church. I also found myself thinking more about communion, and how it is something holy that gives us a connection with God.

The whole experience made me think that I should continue attending church and exploring my faith. Because of YEEK, I now want to go on to be baptised, receive communion and be confirmed. And finally, on the journey home, I realised I had somehow managed to take a live bat (*right*) home with me from YEEK! I have no idea how it got in, but it certainly made for an interesting end to the trip!

This has been the best camp I have ever been to, and I am hopeful I will be attending YEEK next year!

Informed Communion Class

Over the course of six Saturdays, five of our young members participated in a class to explore the symbols and meaning behind the sacraments of Baptism and Eucharist.

Each week we focused on a faith word of the day (Invitation, Remembrance, Sacrament, Love, Create, Thanksgiving) and looked at how those words tied into the experience of communion. Students were invited to explore the sacrament of the Eucharist through sensory play, Biblical story telling, seek and find.

During one session they made unleavened bread that we went on



to use in the main Sunday Morning Eucharist.

In the final two weeks of class, they partnered with "Communion Mentors", whom they each chose, to make their own banners demonstrating what communion means to them.

The banners will go on display in the church on Communion Recognition Sunday,



6th September, when we will recognize class members and support one of our young people as she receives her first holy communion.

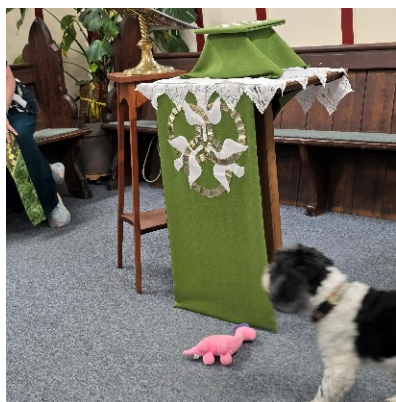
